## **Vulnerable Adult Safeguarding Statement and Policy -**

## **Yvon Bonenfant Vocal Art**

Yvon Bonenfant VA is committed to keeping vulnerable adults safe from harm. Yvon Bonenfant VA recognises that the protection and welfare of vulnerable adults is of paramount importance, regardless of all other considerations. Yvon Bonenfant VA fully complies with its statutory obligations under the relevant legislation<sup>1</sup> relating to the protection of vulnerable adults.

Yvon Bonenfant VA has procedures to keep vulnerable adults safe when they are working on the project. Yvon Bonenfant VA staff and volunteers who work with vulnerable adults and families are Garda vetted, qualified and receive supervision. Additionally, all facilitators are expected to adhere to best practice in their own procedures for workshops and performances. Yvon Bonenfant VA staff, volunteers, and participants discuss and agree on codes of appropriate conduct and adhere to these codes of behaviour. Yvon Bonenfant VA also respects confidentiality requirements in dealing with vulnerable adult protection matters. We listen to vulnerable adults and act on what they say. We respond to all concerns as soon as we are aware of them.

Yvon Bonenfant VA fully co-operates with the relevant statutory authorities in relation to young people/vulnerable adults protection and welfare matters. We adopt safe practices and a Code of Behaviour to minimise the possibility of harm or accidents happening to vulnerable adults and participants and protect staff and volunteers from the need to take unnecessary risks that may leave themselves open to accusation of abuse or neglect.<sup>2</sup>

We use HSE training systems to ensure that our staff and volunteers know how best to safeguard vulnerable adults. Training records and procedures are kept note of, and all Yvon Bonenfant VA members are both fully trained and inducted into work at any site in which we may interact with vulnerable adults, are given contact persons and guidance as appropriate. At all times, our project prioritises the safety and well-being of all individuals involved, adhering rigorously to the Safeguarding Vulnerable Persons at Risk of Abuse (2014)
